Burgess Park is a welcoming green space where many families - especially Latin American communities - come to relax, socialise, and enjoy nature. To make sure the park stays a beautiful, safe, and healthy environment for everyone, we invite you to visit our Community Information Panel.

This initiative is organised by Local Action Families UK and created especially for those who use the park regularly. Our panel will provide practical, easy-to-understand information in Spanish about how we can live in greater harmony with the local ecology - from protecting plants and wildlife to keeping public areas clean.

What will you find at the information panel?

- Simple guidance in Spanish on reducing plastic waste, removing balloons and decorations after parties, and preventing litter in green spaces.
- Information on using bins properly and recycling so that wildlife is not at risk and public spaces remain clean.
- Advice on how small actions - such as picking up balloons, wrappers, or disposable items - can make a big difference.
- Discussion on why we need more bins and greater care as the number of visitors to the park continues to grow.

Why is this important?

In recent years, more and more people have been enjoying Burgess Park, especially during weekends and holidays. With this increased use, we need to look after the environment together. By working as a community - keeping plastic out of the grass and water, putting litter in the right places, and looking after the plants and animals that live here - we can all help to preserve the park for future generations.
